I am excited to apply for the position of Dean of University Libraries at the University of Florida (UF). Throughout my career, I have led transformative initiatives, forged strategic institutional partnerships, and positioned libraries as integral drivers of research and learning. I am eager to bring this experience to UF, ensuring the Libraries continue to serve as a cornerstone of academic excellence.

Currently, as Dean at the University of New Mexico (UNM), I manage a comprehensive library system at a flagship R1 university, overseeing a \$20 million annual budget, multiple library locations, and diverse academic programs. Previously, as Associate Dean at Penn State University Libraries, one of North America's largest research library systems, I provided leadership across 20 campus libraries, directed over 350 faculty and staff, and supported approximately 90,000 students statewide.

My experience in strategic planning, budget oversight, and fundraising reflects my capacity to lead academic libraries effectively while adapting thoughtfully to different institutional cultures. At Penn State, I spearheaded an extensive strategic planning initiative involving over 300 library employees across 20 campuses, using surveys, focus groups, and crossfunctional teams. This inclusive process significantly strengthened interdisciplinary research support and enhanced library services across the university.

At UNM, I began my tenure by individually meeting with nearly every library employee to deeply understand their experiences, organizational traditions, and needs. These discussions informed our strategic planning process, engaging most of the 120 faculty and staff, and led directly to initiatives that strengthened employee engagement, communication, and morale, such as:

- Dean-Staff Council, facilitating inclusive decision-making and communication;
- Monthly All-College Meetings, promoting transparency and community;
- **Dean's Open Office Hours**, fostering individual trust and open dialogue.

Supporting staff development has been a priority. I increased annual professional development funding, quadrupled the budget for workspace renovations, and introduced flexible work arrangements within an experimental framework. Additionally, I secured a \$1 million endowment supporting mentorship programs, career development, and skill-building initiatives, enhancing the Libraries' organizational strength and service excellence.

Upon joining UNM, I recognized that fundraising had historically lagged. I strategically partnered with the university foundation and senior leadership to realign fundraising with the Libraries' mission. These efforts consistently exceeded annual fundraising goals—

achieving 109%, 270%, and 320% in my first three years, with projections surpassing 800% in year four. A significant outcome was establishing the College's first endowed librarian position, which enabled impactful programming such as *Zimfest*—an event connecting students to library resources, academic support, and community-building activities, directly improving student success.

Collaboration, advocacy, and stakeholder engagement are central to my leadership philosophy. At UNM, I co-led an interdisciplinary cluster-hire proposal with the Vice President for Research, strategically aligning library expertise with institutional research priorities. As Chair of the Academic Technology Advisory Board, I collaborated closely with the Chief Information Officer to enhance campus cybersecurity and optimize technology infrastructure.

Nationally, as President of the Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL), I established and led the AI Competencies Task Force, assembling national experts to define essential AI skills for library professionals. At the state level, I advised New Mexico legislators on drafting the state's AI education bill, influencing policy supportive of statewide AI literacy initiatives. Additionally, my commentary and interviews in national and international media outlets—including *The Guardian*, *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, and *Inside Higher Ed*—has elevated public awareness of academic libraries and highlighted their critical role in advancing education and research.

My commitment to digital scholarship, open-access initiatives, and innovative library technologies is demonstrated through impactful programs at UNM and Penn State. At UNM, I initiated an Open Educational Resources (OER) program by strategically hiring the university's first dedicated OER librarian and establishing a campus-wide steering committee with faculty, students, and senior administrators. This collaboration secured a \$2.125 million federal grant and established the statewide New Mexico OER Consortium, resulting in annual savings of approximately \$400,000 for UNM students.

At Penn State, I played a key role in launching the nationally recognized Center for Black Digital Research (CBDR), partnering closely with founding faculty directors, university leadership, and external scholars to build infrastructure, secure funding, and promote interdisciplinary research in digital humanities, data science, and Black studies. The CBDR exemplifies my ability to foster high-impact scholarly collaboration and elevate institutional visibility.

My professional values strongly align with UF's commitment to excellence, innovation, discovery, stewardship, and community engagement. I prioritize transparent leadership, careful resource management, and cultivating an environment that encourages

collaboration and innovation. Libraries thrive when they connect students, faculty, and the broader community through relationships built on trust and respect. UF's ambitious vision, particularly its leadership in artificial intelligence and interdisciplinary research, closely matches my experience and passion. I welcome the opportunity to further discuss how my leadership and experiences can support UF Libraries' strategic goals and contribute meaningfully to the university's continued prominence.
